Archdiocese of Brisbane Synod24 - Reflection on the First Session

Dear Parishioners,

Last week, Petra Galea from our Pastoral Council and I attended the first session of the Archdiocesan Synod, which took place over two full days in Brisbane. It was an intense period of discernment and deliberation as we considered many proposals presented by the Synod Engagement and Writing Teams, who have spent months gathering insights through listening and consultation.

To be honest, I approached the Synod with a certain level of apprehension. After years of consultations and document writing, it often felt like little action followed. I was also uncertain about how we would navigate the challenging task of embracing the diverse cultures and traditions within our Church while walking the *Via Media*—the middle road. However, the experience left me filled with hope and joy. The Holy Spirit was clearly at work, guiding the hearts and minds of Synod members as we engaged in meaningful conversations.



Reflecting on our shared experience, Petra observed, "We really found a community spirit, and the sense of bonding as a family has been a lovely experience." This spirit of family is a crucial aspect of the Synodal journey, as it allows us to engage in deep, respectful conversations, even when they are challenging. Through these discussions, our minds and hearts open to the broader vision of the Church and its role in the world, fostering growth and, when necessary, change.

The Synod discussions took place within the framework of 'Conversation in the Spirit.' Each member of the group had uninterrupted time to speak, share, and even challenge one another. These conversations were interwoven with moments of prayer and communal reflection, creating space for genuine engagement.

At the conclusion of the First Session of Synod24 (with another session to take place in October), though my mind felt exhausted, my heart was filled with hope for the future of our Church. From the Archdiocese to our parishes, let us work together to build a more optimistic, collaborative, and hopeful Church—where everyone, young and old, new and experienced, finds a rightful place. Together, we grow. And where necessary, we embrace change.

#### PETER'S MONOLOGUE - GET BEHIND ME SATAN!

When he asked us who we thought he was, the answer was clear. He was the hope of the poor, forgiveness for sinners, justice for all people. He is the Christ. He is the Son of the living God. I was only saying what everyone else was thinking. You couldn't travel with him and share his life, like we did, and not come to really know him.



He seemed happy at first. I don't really understand what he said next, but it was pretty full on. The Father revealing; me being a rock, changing my name, the power to bind and loose... He was very excited. But then suddenly his mood changed.

He said he was planning to go to Jerusalem. I could not believe it. The people loved him. But because of this the Chief Priest, Scribes and most of Pharisees saw him as a threat. Jerusalem. The Roman are bad enough, but with all the others, Jerusalem is the last place he needs to be. He knows that, we know that, so why do it? It makes no sense.

So took him aside and I told him: He can't let this happen! We were sitting by the road a little further along than the others. He was looking tired and worried.

He looked up at me and said it. I'll never forget it. 'Get behind me! Satan.'

I must've looked shocked, but he kept on. 'You are an obstacle in my path. Your way of thinking is not God's way.'

I was so angry. He turned and walked back to the others. Slowly I walked back.

He was sitting, eating some bread, and as he ate he began to speak. 'If you want to follow me, forget yourself, your life, your fear, and follow me. Even to death.'

What does he expect of us? We have all given up so much for him. We believe in him. We know him to be the Christ. Yet he wants more! Do we follow him to death in Jerusalem?

# **GOSPEL FOCUS**


#### Peter's insight

When Peter answers Jesus' question he demonstrates the disciples' dawning awareness of Jesus' true identity. It is the first occasion that the disciples are called to own what they think about Jesus. However, when Jesus begins to spell out what being the Messiah really means – persecution and death – Peter tries to convince Jesus that he doesn't need to go down that path. Jesus turns on Peter and snaps, "Get behind me, Satan!" It is a reminder of the desert temptation Jesus had to face at the start of his ministry when he wrestled with what sort of messiah he was called to be.

# SCPIPTUPAL CONTEXT

#### **A Turning Point**

This passage forms a crucial turning point in the Gospel of Mark. It occurs at the very mid-point of the gospel – the end of chapter 8 in a 16 chapter gospel. From this point on the gospel takes a greater focus on what it means to be a disciple and Jesus' movement towards Jerusalem. This passage in which Peter processes his faith in Jesus as the Messiah is immediately followed by the account of the Transfiguration. From this point onwards, the gospel writer reveals the growing understanding of Jesus' identity that until now has been wrapped in secrecy.




